- Film Electives are satisfied by taking any of the following: Special Topics in Film (FIL2930), Photography I (PGY2401C), Acting I (TTP2110C), Film Acting (TPP2260C), Stagecraft (TPA2200C), Stage Makeup (TPA2248), or Computer Literacy (CGS1060C - based on placement score, [this course may be required.](#))
- MGF1106 and MGF1107 are general education math courses that do not require prerequisites. MGF1106 and MGF1107 do not require prerequisites. MAC1105C is a 5-credit course. Students who register for this course must see an advisor to discuss their academic plan.
- Many courses have specific pre-requisite and co-requisite requirements that must be followed. Students are encouraged to consult the Course Information Table for a detailed list of all requisite requirements at [www.broward.edu](http://www.broward.edu).
- In addition to class time (4.5 hours for the A.S. Program), students will be expected to put in a total of 9 hours per week to accomplish stated objectives, either as homework or to attend posted lab / studio hours. Sign-in is required.
- Internship (FIL2945) is a restricted course. Students are encouraged to research and apply for an internship in their preferred field, with a legitimate and active organization. To enroll, the internship must be approved by the Program Manager.
