

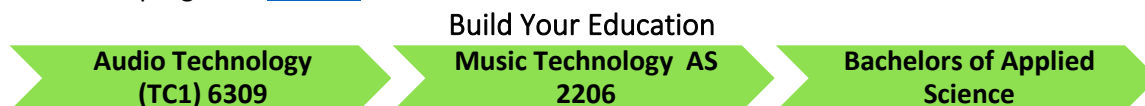

- The National Association of Schools of Music ([NASM](#)) accredits Broward College. Declared music students MUST contact advising through the Visual & Performing Arts (V&PA) Department by calling 954-201-6843 or e-mail VPADept@broward.edu at the beginning of their studies.
- Students may take Music Appreciation (MUL2010) in place of American Pop Music (MUH2019).
- Students are recommended to take MGF1106 or MGF1107 to fulfill the general education math credit. MGF1106 and MGF1107 do not require prerequisites. MAC1105C is a 5-credit course. Students who register for this course must see an advisor to discuss their academic plan.
- Applied Music Electives (MVXXXXX and most MUNXXXX courses) are restricted classes. These courses must be registered with the V&PA Department each term.
- Music Technology Electives: Music Marketing (MUM2730), Mixing and Mastering (MUM2602C), or Introduction to Business (GEB1011). Mixing and Mastering (MUM2602C) must be taken in the last semester.
- Internship (MUS2940) is a restricted course. Students are encouraged to research and apply for an internship in their preferred field, with a legitimate and active organization. To enroll, the internship site must be approved by the Program Manager.

This is only a recommended course sequence. Students are strongly encouraged to meet with an [advisor](#) to create a personalized educational plan.
